BUILDING HISTORY

Excerpt from “Churchill Fulshear Jr.: His Land, His Family, His Home and His Legacy,” by Terry Crockett, Fulshear Magazine/Explore Fulshear, May 4 2020.

“There was a fire in 1910 that destroyed most of the buildings in downtown at that time. Following the fire, in 1911, J.G. Mayes and M.K. Mayes built a two story building on the southeast corner of FM 1093 and FM 359 which was called the Mayes Building. The first businesses in this building included M. Solomon Dry Goods, M.K. Mayes General Merchandise and J.G. Mayes Saloon” (pg 32).
